IT ALL BEGINS WITH IHMS

When Adrian Hawaleshka entered the hallways of Immaculate Heart of Mary School in 1974 to begin Kindergarten, he certainly did not know that his association and fond memories of the School would be re-kindled years later through his son Luka.

Adrian graduated from IHMS in grade eight in 1983 and attended St. Paul's High School. He affirmed his commitment to working hard and service to others at St. Paul's, where he graduated valedictorian and received the Governor General's Academic Medal.

Adrian went on to obtain his BSC, completed medical school, and finally completed a 5-year Royal College Accredited Anesthesia Program at the University of Manitoba. Adrian has been working as an anesthetist ever since.

For about 20 years of his career, Adrian worked at the Health Sciences Centre (HSC) in Winnipeg as an anesthetist. Adrian shared that "the excitement of dealing with challenging cases was exhilarating".

It was during this time, that he accepted the Medical Director position of the InterHospital Transport Team.

After a significant personal life change, Adrian started working a percentage of his time in the

Northern communities of Manitoba. He became Head of Anesthesia in The Pas. At its peak, he was working 50% of his time in The Pas and 50% at HSC. After meeting his wife Joleen, his northern work decreased organically. Additionally, he became the Medical Director of the Operating Rooms at Children's Dental World.

Today, Adrian works in the private sector as an anesthetist. He is also an author of children's books.

Over the years, Adrian had the opportunity to share his skills in service to those most in need at the time. He traveled to Bolivia

with Operative Medical Missions and also had the honour of going to Ukraine three times with medical missions organized by Dr. Oleh Antonyshyn from Toronto. This experience was designed to treat soldiers physically ravaged by war. The latter was exhausting, emotional and extremely rewarding.

Adrian and his wife Joleen have a 10year old son, Luka, a current student at IHMS. They appreciate that the School has a quiet and structured environment that Luka is excelling in. They also value

the emphasis on service and spiritual development.

Adrian shared that "I think IHMS has played a big part in shaping who I am today. The sense of the importance of community service... of

helping others... begins for me with IHMS." He goes on to explain how IHMS is an excellent experience for his family today. "Luka has loved it from the second he got there. The structure and teachers have made him feel at home and he literally is excited to go to school every day."



Justina Tychanski ('09)

After high school, Justina attended the University of Manitoba then journeyed to Toronto for a few years to continue her education, and eventually returning back to Winnipeg last year. As a recent university graduate in 2020, Justina says beginning to navigate the workforce during a pandemic has been a wild ride. "Continuing to physically go into work during this time has certainly taught one how to stay on their toes, from an

abundance of personal protection equipment to the ever-evolving guidelines with public-facing jobs."

Recently, Justina began to work at one of the Covid-19 vaccination supersites in Winnipeg. When asked about her motivation behind wanting to work there, she says, "As a healthcare professional, I met the province's extended eligibility criteria to help accelerate the vaccination rollout. Working with others from various disciplines under Shared Health has been a very exciting opportunity to combat Covid and help expedite our return to the pre-pandemic life!"

Reflecting on her time at Immaculate Heart of Mary, she says that the School instills a strong sense of community and is constantly encouraging the spirit of giving. There is always a beaming example of giving back wherever you turn in the School: teachers going above and beyond for their students, a phenomenal administration and support staff who truly care and go the extra mile, and countless volunteers behind so many of the School events. She says, "I'd like to think I've carried forward that community-minded approach into my line of work now."



Justin Mezibroski ('07)

Justin Mezibroski is now working as a Registered Respiratory Therapist at the Health Sciences Centre. His role as a Respiratory Therapist revolves around making sure people are breathing, to put it succinctly. In the intensive care units it means managing people on life support. In the ER this means using various equipment to support someone breathing so they don't end up on life support or starting someone on life support when there is no longer an alternative.

Justin's career as a therapist started just over a year ago, during the Covid-19 pandemic. He graduated, then transitioned from student clinicals to becoming a staff therapist. Justin shares, "Having been thrown right into the frontline of the pandemic first had me excited. Here I was equipped with a unique skill set that is extremely relevant in the management of a respiratory pandemic." During the summer months the infection numbers were low and the ICUs were at normal capacity. Then November came and cases skyrocketed. The ICUs exploded with Covid patients and there were outbreaks on different wards. Justin continues, "In the span of a few months I went from eager and bright eyed to stressed and weary. I couldn't anticipate how stressful my job would become in such a short time." The nature of the job entails experiencing the death of patients with a higher frequency then most hospital positions. The lethality of Covid-19 in patients on life support has brought this to an almost unbearable level.

In order to cope in this pandemic Justin reminds himself of the positives of his work. "God has given me the ability to learn a skill set that allows me to care for the sickest people in our province. I have the strength to administer this care despite ever increasing challenges. The joy of seeing someone leave the ICU in better shape then they came in is unimaginable. Knowing that I am learning at an accelerated rate and will be better able to serve my patients in the future is inspiring."
